ESPA ELECTION REPORT 2014

Get to know your new ExBo!

As members will be aware ESPA was set up as a democratic society which is run by and for the benefit of its members. This means that we hold periodic elections for the three statutory officers of the society – the president, honorary secretary and honorary treasurer – and for members of the Executive Board, which is effectively the directorate of the Society.

According to the ESPA statutes the Executive Board (ExBo) may consist of up to ten members and the current ExBo has decided to keep this maximum number for the next two years. As Neil Morton is only half way through his term of office as

president and will remain in that office until 2015, there are nine other posts to be filled including the honorary treasurer, secretary and the vice-president who will be the president-elect. Therefore there were six other vacancies for members of the ExBo.

In the summer of 2014 we held elections for these officers and members of the Executive Board and the results are given below. You can click on the election statements of the new officers and ExBo members and get to know them a little.

PAEDIATRIC ANAESTHESIA IN TURKEY – HOSTING COUNTRY FOR ESPA ANNUAL CONGRESS 2015

The first anesthesia practices started at the time of Ottoman Empire, between 1854 and 1856 at the Crimean War with the chloroform anesthesia applications to over 1000 soldiers. A lot of books were written in Turkish, French and Persian. Anesthesia developed rapidly since 1956 with the usage of volatile anesthetics in Turkey.

According to the 2012 Turkish Health Statistics of Ministry of Health, 24.9% of the overall population in Turkey is between the ages of 0-14. In other words, roughly every 1 person out of 4 is a child. This makes the medical areas regarding the children extremely important. There are 1483 inpatient treatment facilities in Turkey and 65 of them are university hospitals. There have been 4,410,228 surgeries in Turkey in the year of 2012. Almost 1/5 of those surgeries include children cases. Namely 800,000 children are operated with different reasons in a year.



With the developments in socioeconomic and sociocultural levels in Turkey, the application of anesthesia in children became more widespread. With the confidence parents and families have regarding anesthesia, the demand for sedation even in simple operations increased. While this is pleasing in the name of the given value to our profession it also brings a heavy load of work to do.

Anesthesia expertise duration is 4 years in Turkey. 6 months of that duration is specifically for pediatric anesthesia. Expertise education is being given in universities and the training and research hospitals of the Ministry of Health. With the cooperation of Turkish Anesthesiology and Reanimation Association and Ministry of Health, the education became

standardized. The basic information on the assessment of pediatric patients, physiology and anatomy is given during the anesthesia expertise education. The students of the expertise education learn all of the difficult airway technics and invasive intravenous attempts. The education of regional block is a routine. The developments in ultrasonography are being followed and being used in the operations of opening an airway, intravenous technics and blocks. All of the anesthesia experts get basic pediatric anesthesia education. Organ transplantation, cancer surgeries, cardiac surgeries for pediatric patients are common in university hospitals and big training centers. Doctors practicing anesthesia in major surgeries specifically work for pediatric anesthesia.

There are almost 5000 anesthetists in Turkey. Although pediatric anesthesia is not a certification or a post specialization there are roughly 500 doctors specialized in pediatric anesthesia. Most of these doctors are anaesthetizing only pediatric patients. A few of them are also anaesthetizing adults too because of the work distribution. The developments in advanced imaging technics and interventional radiology increased the amount anaesthetizing out of the surgery room.

There is one national anesthesia association in Turkey. The Turkish Anesthesiology and Reanimation Society includes a lot of sub-groups and pediatric anesthesia is one of those sub-groups. The association now has 250 members, the amount is increasing every day and it became a member of FEAPA in 2000. The high population of children in Turkey makes pediatric anesthesia special. Anesthesia and pediatric anesthesia which are already valued in Turkey have a promising future. Our dear colleagues moved ASPA to the West by hosting ASPA 2014 in Istanbul. Young and dynamic population aspired ESPA 2015 to be in Turkey and with the support of the European colleagues this dream has come to be true. ESPA 2015 will be held in the youngest populated country of Europe and in the oldest city of it, İstanbul. As being a bridge between east and West, Istanbul is also has the heritage of both Ottoman and Roman Empires.

It will be an honor to be hosting you in Istanbul for ESPA.

THE PRAGUE CONGRESS 2014 - COMING SOON!


Dear colleagues,
