The Paediatric Anaesthesia Department

The department currently has 25 consultants, including national and internationally recognised leaders in areas such as regional anaesthesia and sustainability.

Our service delivers anaesthesia for neonates, infants, children and young people across a broad case-mix, ranging from day-case surgery to complex tertiary referrals. There are nine main theatres, with additional remote areas.

Specialities covered include:

- General Paediatric & Neonatal surgery
- Urology
- Orthopaedic
- ENT surgery
- Neurosurgery
- Burns/Plastics
- Cleft
- Scoliosis Surgery
- Oncology/Haematology
- Interventional Cardiology & Cardiac surgery
- Renal (including transplantation)

- Dental
- Ophthalmology
- Sedation and non-theatre anaesthesia

There is a superb acute pain service comprising five nurses and two consultants, which runs seven days a week and a nurse-led preoperative assessment service.



The Fellowship

The Paediatric Anaesthesia Fellowship at BRHC is designed for anaesthetists who wish to consolidate and advance their skills in paediatric anaesthesia within a high-volume regional centre. Many of our fellows have gone on to secure substantive consultant posts in tertiary centres.

The fellowship aims to:

- Provide broad exposure to routine and complex paediatric cases
- Support the transition to consultant-level practice or further subspecialty training

What the fellowship involves:

- Participation in a 1:8 on-call rota including out-of-hours.
- Opportunities to develop advanced airway, regional and peri-operative skills.
- Participation in departmental teaching, simulation and governance meetings
- Opportunities to undertake audit, quality improvement and engage in research and innovation

Who Should Apply?

- Senior anaesthetic trainees approaching completion of training with an interest in paediatric anaesthesia
- Post-CCT anaesthetists seeking further paediatric experience
- International applicants with appropriate anaesthetic training and registration

How to Apply

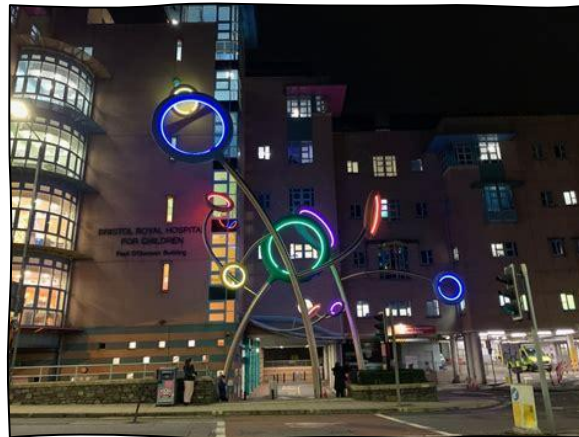
Fellowships are typically offered 12 months starting in August. The post is advertised nationally via NHS Jobs or the UHBW portal approximately 6 months prior.
